Reflection for the 3rd Sunday in Advent

The unimaginable Glory of God

Yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.

Matthew 11:11

In today's Gospel, Jesus praises John the Baptist as the greatest of the Old Testament prophets. Yet, Jesus adds this enigmatic comment, "yet, the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." Is Jesus downplaying John's status?

Rather, Jesus is shifting our focus away from John onto himself and us... As great as the Old Testament is, and the holy men and women who are featured in it, this holiness is a pale reflection of the overwhelming glory of Jesus and the Kingdom of God.

I often think of how our human minds have so little grasp of the glory of God that we will encounter in the Kingdom. We simply cannot imagine the infinite beauty, love and sanctity that is God.

You and I are so very privileged, through the person of Jesus, to be offered a place in that Kingdom. We will spend an eternity giving thanks to God, and even that will not be enough.

I Need Jesus

She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.

Matthew 1:21

When it's my turn to manage an event, speak, teach or even turn in a big project, I don't feel consciously nervous. But then afterward, the release and relief I feel betrays that maybe, just maybe I didn't know how nervous I actually was. Maybe you've experienced this too, in other ways: I didn't know how tired I was! I didn't realize how hungry I was!

Advent is time to take stock: of emptiness, of sin, of misdirection in our journey. The Scriptures, prayers and images of these weeks have perhaps revealed something to us: I didn't realize how much I need Jesus.

But he knows, of course. And here he is, God with us, come to save us from our sins that we've ignored or hidden and the desire for peace that perhaps we didn't realize can only be found in him. Jesus, only you can fill my heart.
