Unity in Christ

I heard you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that... there be no divisions among you.

1 Corinthians 1:10

In the early days of the Church, the apostles brought together vastly different communities. It took time to discern how believers were called to live their faith – like whether newly converted gentiles should observe Jewish practices. Sts. Peter and Paul themselves debated the issue vigorously. They also prayed together, listened to one another and allowed the Holy Spirit to guide them to a resolution.

We don't always agree about how to follow Jesus either. Facing complex issues together calls for patience and deep humility, yet, sadly, sometimes we aren't even civil to each other. This defies our unity in Christ. Our task as disciples is not to judge or belittle. It is to study Scripture, learn the teachings of the Church and listen for the voice of God in our hearts – and above all, to love one another as Jesus taught.

The Least of These

...God chose the weak of the world to shame the strong...

1 Corinthians 1:27

The world's priorities are completely upside down from what disciples of Jesus values. It's as true today as when our Lord gave his famous Sermon on the Mount. When my faith runs counter to the values of my party, family, tribe or culture, how do I put God first?

What is the radical worldview that offends the powers that be? It runs through all of Scripture: God stands on the side of losers everywhere.

Jesus pronounces God's blessings and favour on a special group, who in the Old Testament were known by a Hebrew term laden with meaning and often written in English as the "anawim." They were the poor, the meek, the downtrodden and the forsaken. The anawim are not just those on the margins of society but those overwhelmed by need who can only turn to God. What is our lesson here? First, like the anawim, may we embrace our own absolute dependence on God. Second, in imitating Jesus, may our greatest concern go to those in most need.
