## Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

**If a foot should say, "Because I am not a hand I do not belong to the body," it does not for this reason belong any less to the body. (1 Corinthians 12:15)**

When we read St. Paul's words here about the body of Christ, we often think of the Church as a whole. We think of a beautiful, complex ensemble made of many different parts.

At the same time, though, you might feel that you're an insignificant part - a foot rather than a hand, as St. Paul would say (1 Corinthians 12:15). So many people seem to be more vital to the functioning of the body of Christ than yourself. There's the mom of six kids, on the parish council, who has a son in seminary. Or the successful businessman who generously gave thousands of dollars to fix the church's bell tower. Or the widow who leads a Bible study and never misses daily Mass. Or the popular preacher who has a million followers on You Tube. Are you really as important as these members?

Absolutely yes! Remember, "God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended" (1 Corinthians 12:18, emphasis added) each member is essential to the proper functioning of the whole body. That includes you. He intends you to be an important part of His body.

How can you be sure? Jesus called you and made you part of His body in Baptism. He knows why he called you-and it's not so that you would be exactly like someone else. He loves you in a way that he loves no one else. That means you are just as dear to his heart as the people who might look like superstars to you.

So try seeing the body of Christ-and yourself-the way God does. Each person has a role to play, and if everyone were the same, the Church wouldn't be all that God wants it to be. God made you exactly as you are to help make his body the Church, whole.

### 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Factoid One

At the beginning of the twentieth century, there were a few summer homes on the brow, a few businesses on Concession Street, and the area beyond, was largely farmland. Now there was also in 1921, a Catholic Church - Sacred Heart Parish on the mountain. Soon after Sacred Heart Church was established, a two room school building was constructed. As the church- school community grew, the school building was expanded to accommodate the growing enrolment. A lively social life began to flourish in Sacred Heart Parish. There were picnics at Mountain Park, Halloween masquerades for the children, children's Christmas and spring concerts, hayrides in the fall and sleigh rides at Christmas time at Lane's Farm on Upper Gage. The spiritual life of the parish, school activities, and social activities all collaborated and fostered the growth of a wonderful faith filled community.
