Epiphany of the Lord

By the time the wise men arrive, the Gospel recounts that they find Jesus in a house. This detail – which I haven't noticed before – is comforting to me. Somewhere after the unanticipated stable delivery, room was found for the fledgling family. The wise men go seeking Jesus surrounded by his family, held by another family.

We are the people making room for Jesus and for the people who are seeking him in the world today. Right in the middle of the Christmas leftovers, the decorations which will soon be put away, and the ache to get back to routine after feasting, Jesus is with us. The star could be stopping over our imperfect, crowded or messy homes.

The Gospel doesn't talk about what the wise men ate, where they slept or whether things were cleaned up. The star stopped over the place where they could encounter Jesus. And "when they saw that star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy."

Who is overwhelmed with joy at the light God has set over you? Who needs the Jesus that resides in your heart and home? We celebrate Epiphany not so that we can pay homage with the kings of Jesus' time, but so that we can practise being overwhelmed with joy by the places in our lives where the star has stopped – even when that place is within us.

100th Anniversary Factoid #3

In the 1920's and the 1930's, the Sacred Heart Parish Community continued to grow in numbers and in their devotion to our Lord Jesus Christ. Throughout the year, the collaboration of parish and school was celebrated in different activities and celebrations. Each May, one child had the honor of crowning the statue of Mary. A procession of all children formed in the rectory, then they paraded over a carpet of flower petals to the church for the crowning ceremony. At First Communion, Father Kirby arranged an archway of flowers at the front of the church, with the words: "Let the little children come unto Me." Regular masses were held in the church during the week and on Sundays. There was an organist but no choir. At Requiem masses, Father Kirby called on two of the parish children, Helen Jamieson and Jack Donelson to sing. Sacred Heart Parish under the direction of Father Kirby had developed into a community dedicated to living the Word of God.
