Reflection for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Becoming Neighbours

“Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robber’s victim?” He answered, “The one who treated him with mercy.” Jesus said to him, “Go and do likewise.” Luke 10:36-37

Jesus shifts the focus of the question posed by the self-justifying lawyer. Instead of defining who belongs to the category of neighbor, our Lord wants to know who proved himself to be a neighbor to the man who fell among robbers. Neighbour is something that we become by actively responding to those whose shared humanity makes a claim on us. We become neighbours by virtue of our attentiveness to the needs of others.

This story speaks to us of the overcoming of estrangement. The Fathers of the Church identified both the man stricken, beaten and left for dead as well as the saving intervention of the Samaritan with the redemptive work of Christ. He is the one who took upon himself our estrangement, stricken for our sake, to bind up our wounds and restore us to health. He is our saving victim. Fr. Dennis Gallagher, A.A.

Annual Novena to St. Ann (July 18-26).

St. Ann's Parish in Hamilton will be hosting 9 days of prayer to invoke the intercession of St. Ann, the Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Grandmother of Jesus Christ. Each evening there will be Holy Mass at 7pm along with the Novena prayers before the relic. The homilies will be part two of our "Faith in Stained Glass" series that will highlight nine of the stained-glass windows that beautify the church and artistically teach the faith. Pastoral Emergency Calls at Hamilton Health Science sites – McMaster, General & Juravinski

Effective June 29, a new system for contacting a Catholic Priest to attend the dying for each HHS site comes into effect. HHS switchboard will no longer contact the Priest on-call in case of pastoral urgency at General, McMaster or Juravinski Hospitals. Instead, a self-governed call-forwarding system has been established by the Hamilton Deanery. Each HHS site will have a telephone number that can be accessed through the nurses' station and used by Hospital staff, or patient families, to call for a Priest to offer the Anointing for the sick and dying in urgent need **at 289-768-4883**. For all other spiritual needs while in hospital – counselling, reception of Holy Communion, or other needs – please contact your own Parish. NOTE: this change does not impact Saint Joseph Hospital. It's always a good idea to let the Parish know if you anticipate a hospital stay so that arrangements can be made for a pastoral visit.
