Laudato Si – On The Care For Our Common Home

An Encyclical published by His Holiness Pope Francis in 2015

Ecological conversion!

“Political institutions and various other social groups are also entrusted with helping to raise people’s awareness. So too is the Church. All Christian communities have an important role to play in ecological education. It is my hope that our seminaries and houses of information will provide an education in responsible simplicity of life, in grateful contemplation of God’s world, and in concern for the needs of the poor and the protection of the environment. Because stakes are so high, we need institutions empowered to impose penalties for damage inflicted on the environment. But we also need the personal qualities of self-control and willingness to learn from one another.”

If we want to bring about deep change, we need to realize that certain mindsets really do influence our behaviour. Our efforts at education will be inadequate and ineffectual unless we strive to promote a new way of thinking about human beings, life, society and our relationship with nature. Otherwise, the paradigm of consumerism will continue to advance with the help of the media and the highly effective workings of the market.”

“The rich heritage of Christian spirituality, the fruit of twenty centuries of personal and communal experience, has a precious contribution to make to the renewal of humanity. I am interested in how such a spirituality can motivate us to a more passionate concern for the protection of our world. A commitment this lofty cannot be sustained by doctrine alone, without a spirituality capable of inspiring us, without an interior impulse which encourages, motivates, nourishes and gives meaning to our individual and communal activity. The ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion.”

“It must be said that some committed and prayerful Christians, with the excuse of realism and pragmatism, tend to ridicule expressions of concern for the environment. Others are passive; they choose not to change their habits and thus become inconsistent. So what they all need is an ecological conversion whereby the effects of their encounter with Jesus Christ become evident in their relationship with the world around them. The Australian bishops spoke of the importance of such conversion for achieving reconciliation with creation. To achieve such reconciliation, we must

examine our lives and acknowledge the ways in which we have harmed God's creation through our actions and our failure to act. The ecological conversion needed to bring about lasting change is also a community conversion."

Comment: Over the past months the columns in the bulletin on Laudato Si, have highlighted some important teachings. Now our Holy Father is asking us to make an ecological conversion.

This is the time in our lives to re-think our relationship with creation and God's earth. We need to decide if we are those Christians who ridicule the expressions of concern for the environment; or we choose to remain passive and do nothing; or we are truly ready to change the way we live and improve our earth. Dedicated Catholics in Canada have launched the '**Canadian Chapter of the Global Catholic Climate Movement**', which is a coalition of over 650 Catholic member groups dedicated to turning Pope Francis' Encyclical Laudato Si into action for climate justice. This is a world-wide movement in many countries. More information will be provided.

Campaign coming this way

Preparations are under way at Sacred Heart Parish for the "One Heart, One Soul" Campaign, and across the diocese, early returns are promising! Through mid-May, 14 Pilot Wave parishes had raised a total of more than \$2.5 million, and an additional \$1.6 million had been pledged by other diocesan supporters and organizations. That total is about 12 percent of the campaign's \$35 million goal. The Pilot Wave will run through June, and three larger, additional waves will follow as the campaign gathers steam and continues through early 2021. Sacred Heart Parish is among more than 30 parishes and a number of mission churches taking part in the next wave. Through the summer, preparations will include forming a volunteer team, developing campaign materials and identifying projects. Kickoff Weekend is tentatively set for September. The campaign is aimed at strengthening parishes and several diocesan wide ministries.
