### His Word to Us

**But to his own disciples he explained everything in private.**

Mark 4:34

Sometimes, the apostles must have felt they were in a secret club. Here was Jesus speaking in parables to the crowd on the seashore. The mustard bush. The sower. The lamp under the bushel.

The Lord spoke in parables hoping they might understand. Even the apostles struggled, however, as we learn just a few verses before today's gospel reading. They questioned Jesus, too, about the parables, and you can sense the Lord's frustration. If you don't understand this one, he says, how will you understand any of them? Yet with patients, the Lord "explained everything in private."

Now here's the big reveal. You and me, we are all now blessed to be part of that same club. Through Scripture, the saints and the Church, the Lord explains everything with the same clarity he spoke to the apostles. We have received the same gifts first given to them on that Galilean shore.

Father Charlie Jordan came to Sacred Heart parish as pastor on July 1, 2016. From the beginning of his appointment, and in his introduction to the parish, Father Charlie was very enthusiastic about the opportunity to plan and to celebrate Sacred Heart Parish's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Father Charlie had the duo task of being pastor for both Sacred Heart Parish and Blessed Sacrament Parish. Changes were made to accommodate daily and Sunday masses. Through collaboration in communication and transition planning with both parishes, successful twinning was achieved, and positive relationships were created between Sacred Heart and Blessed Sacrament Parishes. Parishioners were blessed that both our parishes would remain vital and vibrant under Father Charlie's leadership. During this time, Deacon Roy was assigned to assist Father Charlie in both Parishes. Covid 19 struck our world, and in March, 2020, church services and churches underwent many changes as per government directives. With faith and hope, we continued to plan for our 100<sup>th</sup> celebration. Larger social gatherings were not allowed, but reminders of our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary were presented throughout the year. A banner outside the church and one inside the church visually identified this special celebration year. Special Anniversary prayer cards, facial masks, and sweet treats kept the congregation mindful of our centennial year. However, due to ongoing Covid 19 government restrictions, our year of celebration was extended to June 5, 2022. Father Charlie Jordan, with joy, faith, and vision will have led our parishioners into the next century of Sacred Heart Parish- our community with a heart.
