Jesus uses parables to describe various aspects of the **Kingdom of God.**

In today's gospel He teaches that "The kingdom of God is like a mustard seed!" From this small insignificant seed, along with the slow and mysterious power of God, we end up with this huge shrub, where the birds nest and rest.

**Each of us were small insignificant creatures** at one time, and still are. Yet in God's eyes, each of us is also His 'beloved'. We try to follow the Call of the Lord, not knowing what will happen on our journey.

Most of the parables of Jesus deal with agricultural images, that reflect growth and development, important elements in His message of faith to his disciples (and to us). The 'faith' was this seed that Jesus believed, with His grace, could become a tree. This mysterious growth defies our human understanding or logic. God's grace and blessing also defies our human understanding and logic, often surpassing our own hopes and dreams. This Sunday **we are challenged to recognize that we also are the 'seed'**, becoming one with Christ at Baptism, and maintaining the growth of faith within us, by turning to the Lord, in prayer and sacraments, in loving and compassionate deeds, and bringing it to full growth.
