LAUDATO SI – ON THE CARE FOR OUR COMMON HOME

An Encyclical published by His Holiness Pope Francis in 2015 **FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT Ecological Conversion and the**

Challenge of the Temptation in the Desert! In Laudato Si, Pope Francis calls us to an ecological conversion in our efforts to care for our common home. The ecological crisis is also a summons to profound interior conversion. The desert is the setting of today's Gospel – the place where Jesus is led by the Spirit and tempted by the devil. The temptation in the desert gives us much to consider as we reflect on our own ecological conversion this first Sunday of Lent. For those of us who have easy access to the abundance of material products produced by the global socioeconomic order, today's Gospel and its theme of temptation are particularly significant. This is because, in many ways, that system and access to its products are part of what creates the need for ecological conversion in the first place. Efforts to interrupt the very logic of God's creation can result in unintended and terrible ecological consequences. For example: the imposition of industrialized agriculture on large swaths of the planet can have the effect of enriching

the few, while impoverishing many. How do we respond when we are shown that our access to cheap consumer products comes with a human and environmental cost. We cannot serve God while assaulting each other and the earth in all ill-fated quest for worldly power and domination. The temptations faced by Christ in the desert are faced by all people of the earth. This Lent, let us pay extra attention to the need to address the interior deserts within us that leave us weak in the face of temptation and cultivate a Laudato Si spirituality that can help us embrace the call to ecological conversion. This week is a good time to reflect on the temptations to excessive consumerism and waste that cause us to buy what we do not need. Instead let us use our resources to help those in our community that live in poverty, struggling to have food to feed their families. Please make an effort to bring canned goods to Mass next Sunday and place them in the box by the doors of the church.

Please Note: Pope Francis has just released his Apostolic Exhortation – "Querida Amazonia". We will share his words in the weeks to come.
