Laudato Si – On The Care For Our Common Home

An Encyclical published by His Holiness Pope Francis in 2015 **THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT**

"Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey,

was sitting by the well."

There are stories in the Gospel of unexpected and unhoped-for encounters. On that day Jesus crossed Samaria to return to Galilee. He sat by the well as a Samaritan woman approached. Jesus breaks the rule that a man is not to speak in public to lone women, let alone a Samaritan woman. Jesus was thirsty and needed a drink that He accepted from the woman. That day, two thirsts me: those of the road-weary Jesus and a woman who, at mid-day, came to draw water for her family. Jesus approaches the woman with such respect and humility. He knows the depths of human thirst and that is why he does not hesitate to cross the borders and prohibitions that divide humans. In this exchange, asking and receiving are intertwined; we move from ignorance to mutual recognition. What grace!

Our road to Easter crosses the Amazon. It's worth a halt. Let's take our turn to make the time for an encounter. Before the Synod we knew neither the name nor the existence or struggles of the Mura people of Brazil. Today we have heard about them. People such as Oliverra da Silva and Greicilvani dos Santos da Silva. They are the defenders of the Amazon rainforest. the protectors of the Earth. We know that their way of life is threatened by intensive livestock farming and mining. We know about their struggle against land grabbing, deforestation and river pollution. On this Samaritan Sunday, our encounter with them makes us conscious of needing each other, of being interconnected. This week let's move from ignorance of the Mura to recognizing them. Let us join them and be in solidarity understanding their needs and their challenges. As we join in spirit the peoples of the Amazon and share our thoughts and prayers, let us also join with the many people in our Hamilton community who suffer from hunger and poverty. Let us become more aware of those in our community that struggle to survive from day to day. With that awareness let us make every effort to reach out and connect with their needs. Let us take the time to prepare canned and dry goods as well as other everyday items and bring them to Church next weekend. They will be picked up by Neighbour to Neighbour and shared with those in need.

A few changes due to Coronavirus situation...

- We will discontinue Communion from the cup
- Let's not touch each other during the Sign of Peace; a greeting is fine
- The Holy Water fonts have been removed from the Church
- Hand sanitizer is available

Hopefully, soon after Easter we can get back to "normal".
