### Reflection for the 31<sup>st</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time **Be Not Shaken or Stirred**

**We ask you ...not to be shaken out of your minds suddenly...**

2 Thessalonians 2:1-2

Do you remember Y2K? As the clocks turned towards the year 2000, doomsayers predicted a digital disaster, with planes potentially falling out of the skies and banking systems paralyzed. January 1, 2000, came and went without any of these happening.

From the time of the second letter of the Thessalonians was written to today's Internet rumor, Christians have always been tempted by false prophets predicting the end of the world. This is why the writer of today's epistle is warning his people not to fall prey to these messages. Don't be shaken by predictions or claims that "the day of the Lord is at hand" (verse 2). Jesus himself rejected such prophecies, saying that only his Father in heaven knew when the end would come. (see Matthew 24:36) We are called not to guess when the end will come, but to serve the Lord faithfully until our time comes.

*Jesus, let me not be distracted or frightened by false prophets, but focus only on your words.*

### Reflection for the 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time **Eternal Union in Heaven**

**Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be?**

Luke 20:33

Jesus combines two basic and profound teachings in one proclamation – married life on earth and resurrected life in heaven. The Sadducees, his perennial nemeses, solicited this response from Jesus. They had rejected the resurrection and tried to trap him in a contradiction by using an example of marriage. They asked: If seven brothers married the same woman and they all died and rose to heaven, whose wife would she be? Jesus dispelled their trickery by stating their desired answer with none of the above. His reply was that there is no marriage in heaven: so, it was a moot question – "unto death do us part." Marriage certainly can be a beautiful and loving union of two people on earth. Resurrection, however, is an intimate, glorious and eternal union of all people with God in heaven.
