SACRED HEART PARISH 100th ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION SEPTEMBER 18, 1921- SEPTEMBER 18, 2021

The official letter from Bishop Dowling to Father James A. Kirby, newly appointed pastor of Sacred Heart Parish, (September 14, 2021) read: "By these presents you are officially appointed Pastor of the parish of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, Mountain Park Avenue, Hamilton, and about to take charge of same not later than Sunday the 18th of September, 1921. On that day you will announce this appointment to your congregation." With this proclamation Sacred Heart Parish was created 100 years ago and has grown and thrived. We have been preparing to celebrate this very momentous occasion since June, 2020. At this time, our new church doors were installed and blessed, and banners were placed both inside and outside our church with the dates of our 100th Anniversary. Father Charlie and the Anniversary Committee had shared with parishioners the many activities and events that would be held in leading up to this our 100th Anniversary celebration. However, covid-19 put our plans and community gatherings on hold. Some activities were able to be continued such as praying our Sacred Heart Anniversary Prayer at masses, wearing our masks with the 100th Anniversary logo, welcoming past priests and pastors who returned to say mass, and enjoying cookies that we took home to share with our families.

Because of closures, and restrictions due to covid-19, Father Charlie and the Anniversary Committee decided to extend our 100th Anniversary celebrations until June 5, 2022. At that time, on Pentecost Sunday, and in the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart, we will culminate our 100th Anniversary with mass celebrated by Bishop Crosby, followed by brunch. We are hopeful that this extra year of celebration will give us the opportunity to join as a community to attend in person planned events such as coffee Sundays and other monthly gatherings,
